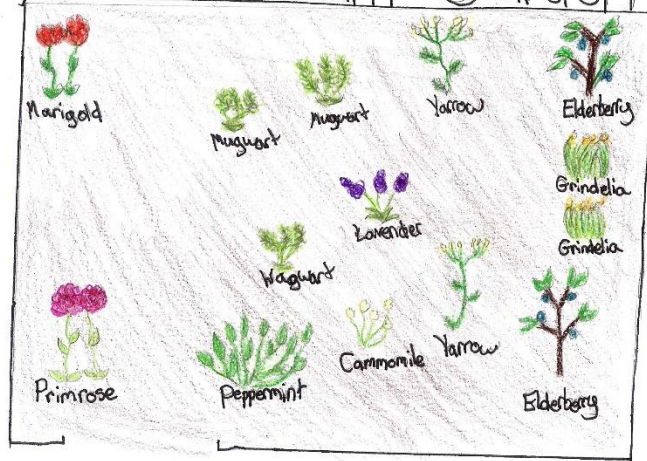
CONCLUSION
